## Grading

There are two categories of grades: Formative and Summative. Summative work are assessments (tests and quizzes) and worth 70% of a student's grade.

Formative work is all other work worth 30% of a student's grade. There is more formative work than summative to prepare students for the higher percentage assessment.

## Homework

I try not to assign homework. If I do, the District has a policy of 1.5 hours of homework Monday through Thursday is allowed. My class is  $\frac{1}{6}$  of a student's total school work, so I can assign 15 minutes of homework for the nights mentioned. As I stated, I try not to assign homework, but a student may need to finish an assignment at home, send an assignment to me via Google Classroom, or need to study a bit to be ready for assessments.

## Assessments

There are 12 weeks in the trimester. There will likely be a quiz (5 questions - 5 points) every week with the exception of the week we have a test. Likely one test every 4 weeks.

## Weekly Schedule/Assignments

There will be bell work each day except Friday. Friday will be for a quiz and the remainder of the period will be set aside for completing missed work. Monday is a minimum day which will often be devoted to vocabulary and gathering materials for the remainder of the week. Tuesday will be devoted to reading, research, and gathering information from multiple resources. Wednesday will be for group discourse where we will discuss issues. Monday through Wednesday will focus on telling the narrative story of the United States. Thursdays we will focus on how the United States is governed through the three branches of government, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. On average, students will complete 2-4 formative assignments worth 5-10 points each.

## Google Classroom

I will post assignments on Google Classroom. I may post the actual document we use in class in Google Classroom as well. Some assignments may be handed out in class, but will still be posted on Google Classroom. Quizzes may also be on Google Classroom or given as a hard copy in class. Any reference to grading in Google Classroom should be ignored. See Aeries for proper grading information.

## Extra Help

Assignments are due prior to the assessment on Friday. Assignments turned in after the assessment will receive partial credit. I will be available to assist students finish late assignments individually in class after Friday assessments.

If students don't complete the assignment by the end of class on Friday, students will have the weekend to finish the assignment for partial credit and must submit the assignment on Monday morning to adhere to the district's late policy. Missed work due to an absence should be obtained as soon as possible. It is the student's responsibility to make up work in a timely manner - within the number of days the student was absent.
